



# Door County Maritime Museum's 29th Annual Classic and Wooden Boat Festival Story by Bill Freyman Photos by Bill Freyman and Nicole Eckert

Door County was at its best for this year's Classic and Wooden Boat Festival at the Door County Maritime Museum in Sturgeon Bay. The event was blessed with terrific weather, large crowds, an exciting Sikaflex Challenge, and the largest turnout of boats in recent memory.

All in all, there were 54 registered boats ranging from a 6" beautifully crafted wooden skiff model to GLACBS members Lois and Bob Snyder's gorgeous 10' self-built Lawton Tender, to a 15' cedar strip Marsh Cat built by Rich and Sandra Dirks of Egg Harbor. Mark and Kimberly Porlier brought their fiberglass 1965 15' Powercat and a terrific collection of classic water skis, all of which generated a great deal of interest. There was an Amphicar, a nice selection of classic Chris Craft boats, Jeff and Renee Davey's beautiful 1949 Higgins Convertible, and Roberta and Rich Hegy's "Glen L," and many more. Everyone enjoyed the display of stunning canoes and kayaks, most built by their owners and one very unique boat, an owner modified 1941 steel lifeboat/pocket tug "Good News."

The Festival is more than a boat show, of course. Friday's pre-event Bay to Lake Lighthouse Cruise initially attracted 14 boats, but four were unable to attend. The remaining 10 had a great time though. Hoping that the morning's northwesterly breeze would settle down a bit, our fleet cruised to the Lake Michigan side first this year, leaving the Museum and cruising through downtown Sturgeon Bay, under the bridges, through the ship canal to the Coast Guard Station on the big lake. The water of Lake Michigan was flat, and once there, all of us had a chance to let the boats tear along. Seeing the boats out on big water at high speed was exciting. Following the high speed runs, we gathered briefly at the Station and paraded together back into the canal much to the delight of the coastguard, several of whom offered to trade their patrol boats for one or two of ours. (There were no takers) We finished the first half of the cruise with our annual stop at the Sturgeon Bay Yacht Club for lunch and a drink.

No event ever takes place exactly as planned. We were lucky to have Jeff Heffernan of Quarterdeck Media along for the cruise photographing the event with traditional cameras and a drone. Working from volunteer Steve Smith's fishing boat, Jeff and his wife followed our boats to Lake Michigan shooting some great video. The breeze from the northwest didn't help much, though, and just before we were to enter the ship canal, the drone snagged a tree limb and dropped into the bay. A prolonged search resulted in nothing but frustration. Even with snorkels and a mask, no one found the missing drone. We'll still enjoy plenty of their photos, however, and some video too, as Jake drove hours on Saturday morning to purchase another drone and lower resolution video that was streamed from the lost drone to Jake's phone may still be good enough to view.

After lunch, several of the boats were able to manage the moderate northwest breeze and make the journey out to Green Bay's Sherwood Point Lighthouse. Those of us who didn't brave the chop, toured the Green Bay side by visiting the Fincantieri shipyard from the water and venturing as far northwest toward the lighthouse as was prudent. Cruising the shore near Potawatomi State Park was fun even if we didn't reach the lighthouse.

Friday evening brought the traditional cocktail reception in the Bridge Room of the Museum provided by the Museum and its volunteers, an event which has become an important part of the boaters' experience at the Festival.

The festival opened Saturday along with the adjacent street fest, Maritime on Madison. The activities mark the end of Maritime Week in Sturgeon Bay, a week dedicated to honoring the men and women of the US Coast Guard and the work they do to keep us safe and secure.

There was, as usual, a lot to see and do. There was the boat show, of course, with all the boats both ashore and in the water. The festival's BoatHouse sale of used nautical treasures was fun. A number of GLACBS members took advantage of the downtown location and did a bit of great shopping. The Coast Guard brought in a 45 footer for the public to tour, and in contrast to that there were Swan Paddle Boats for the public to use. Even our own Dan Holdmann was seen lounging in the rear of a Swan while his family slaved away at the pedals. They were actually buzzed by the Amphicar as it "drove" by out on the bay. Our chapter tent provided shade for those of us who brought boats to the show. Bob and Lois Snyder, Mark and Mary Willis, Jeff Davey and others made sure the public knew that GLACBS was present and involved by giving classic boat rides. They were great ambassadors for our organization.

Kids got to enjoy activities, too. There were sailboats or tugboats to paint, beanbags to toss, and prizes to win. Everyone got to enjoy the concession stand and the freshly caught and fried Door County Whitefish sandwiches. The only complaint about the food was that the Culvers ice cream servings were too big! Best to share with the crew. The Museum was open to the public and free to tour for registered boaters along with the Museum's 100-year-old tug, the "John Purves." Many of us enjoyed viewing the work of Plein Air painters at work on the grounds, the Coast Guard's Damage Control Simulator, and the Coast Guard Auxiliary's "Coastie," a tiny talking robotic tugboat.

And let's not forget the Sikaflex Challenge, a quick and dirty boatbuilding competition that began on Saturday with the boat building and ended on Sunday with the in-the-water time trials. It was a good year for drama, as many of the boats sank before they could finish, and to be truthful, one or two sank before they could even start! Will GLACBS ever chance an entry?

GLACBS members were honored by winning several of the festival's awards. Jane Larson and Gary Berg's "Buster" was recognized as Skippers' Choice 2019 Classic Outboard. Bob and Lois Snyder's 10' Lawson Tender won Skippers' Choice 2019 Non-Powered. Jeff and Renee Davey's Higgins, "Jeffery Dave" was recognized as Skippers' Choice 2019 Classic Inboard and Skippers' Choice Best of Show! Congratulations to them all!

Next year is the Door County Maritime Museum's 30th Annual Classic and Wooden Boat Festival. The anniversary year as one of Wisconsin's oldest classic boat shows will be special and the planning is already underway to make the 30th Festival an event to remember. We plan to get the boats out on the water each day for the public to view and hope to work in a sunset cruise. It would be great to have a really large fleet of GLACBS boats in Sturgeon Bay next year, so mark your calendars now for August 7-9, 2020. Lodging is hard to find if you plan to come at the last minute. The show's website will have the latest news, so bookmark www.doorcountyclassicboatfestival.com and check in often.
