



The boat was built in 1910 by Carl Ibisch who lived in Columbus, Wisconsin.

Brooks Boat Company was in Saginaw, Michigan and built complete and knock down boats. It is not known if the boat was a complete knock down or was built from a local wood – most likely Brooks plans local wood. I have the original plans.

Carl was born October 2nd,1880 in Hamburg Germany and died January 15th, 1968. The boat then passed to his son Alvin who was born April 28th, 1918 and died December 4, 2011. Jack Rhodes from Beaver Dam bought the boat from Alvin on November 2nd, 2004.

Lee J. Wanie bought the boat from Jack on May 7th, 2019.

The boat spent all its life on the Crawfish River and its boathouse by the river in Columbus, Wisconsin. The last years was in a barn on Jack Rhodes farm near Beaver Dam, Wisconsin. This is where it was when I bought it.

The boat was in good condition – most all the wood is original. Some ribs were replaced. It was completely stripped using 5 gallons of Total Boat Stripper. The stem post on the keel was replaced. The bottom was glassed using 2 gallons of West epoxy. The fuel tank was removed and repaired. The propeller shaft was replaced with stainless steel and the stuffing box was rebuilt. The propeller was rebuilt by Moes Marine.

The Motorgo engine is a 2 cycle, 4 hp with a 4 inch bore and 3 1/2 inch stroke. It was built by Lockwood in Jackson, Michigan and marketed by Sears Roebuck. The ignition is a 12 volt battery with buzz coil. It was completely taken down, new rings installed, new carburetor float and rod bearing adjusted.

There were boats like this where I lived on the Rock River in Horicon, Wisconsin until the early 1950's. My wish came true of owning this boat which runs great and fun to take out on the water.

When I was a young boy, I lived across the street from Pewaukee Lake at 410 Park Ave. I helped Bill Tenckhoff with his rent-a-boat business. I and all the kids in the neighborhood helped him clean and wash the boats and help the customers get underway. I even helped the big Cris-Craft boats dock when they would stop in for a drink. When I would tie them up, I would vow to myself that someday I would have a woody, so I started going to the boat shows. I already had a few projects completed, among them a steam engine, a 10-foot racing boat, two strip canoes, and two kit airplanes I flew for years.

I found a plan for a woody that I liked from Glen-L Build a Boat, the 20-foot Riviera with a two row forward, one row in back cockpit. The hull is built by cold-molding methods, plywood and thin veneers over close-

ly spaced framing members. It has two 11ouncelayers of fiberglass on the sides and and bottom. The deck is covered with five ounce layers of fiberglass. I used aged mahogany I had shipped from Colorado.

1 started the boat on Sept. 9, 2012 and finished and launched it on May 31, 2017. The boat is a real performer at top speed of 54mph, and it really gets on plane fast and rides smoothly. So far, it performs perfectly, so I think it is my last big project. That's why 1 named it "Tis It".

Perry's obituary said he was a savvy entrepreneur always in search of new endeavors. Perry passed away Monday, February 15, 2021, after a lung cancer diagnosis just four months before.

The story goes on to say, Perry was a talented builder and inventor spending many of his years operating businesses remodeling homes and crafting and selling various types of furniture to make his living. One of his biggest accomplishments and greatest sources of pride was the opportunity to personally build and customize a new home beginning in 1998 for both himself as well as his loving wife, Jill, of nearly 51 years. He was always well known to be an early-riser and hard worker with a knack for punctuality and a no nonsense attitude who could get things done.

Throughout his full and adventurous life, he enjoyed many hobbies including hunting and fishing, race car driving, real estate investing, traveling and camping in his motor home and his love of restoring classic, antique wooden boats.

Perry had a unique and charismatic personality which was enjoyed by many and will be greatly missed by all.

Perry was always there to volunteer for Glacier Lakes Chapter functions. He was involved with The Pewaukee Boat Show, The January Boat Show at State Fair Park as well as participating at boat shows around the state.

In 2017, Perry and Jill designed and produced special placques for Gordon Moore, Al Hanley and Pete Extrom for their work with the Minocqua show, raising funds for MS. It was a surprise award and presentation in honor of the 25th anniversary with proceeds going to the MS Society for so many years. All the show captains were 100% behind the idea. Perry was always thinking of others.

Perry is survived by his wife Jill; his daughters Tracy (Dwayne) Robinson of Sarasota, FL and Dana (Bryan) Pelz of Kenosha; his grandson, Christopher Pelz of Kenosha; and many other extended family members and friends.

This boat was hanging vertically from his barn rafters with a logging chain clinched around the hull. It was a 1931 17' Dee Wite. I pleated with him not to burn it, gave him \$100 got a trailer and moved the boat out of his sight.

The craft is powered by a Chris-Craft Chevy Corvette engine. The boat has a 5200 bottom, new interior, and a Little Dude tandem trailer.
