
















## Antique Boat and Car Meet Sunday June 24th, 2007 at Karl Johns on Okauchee Lake

# Annual Fathers Day Port Edwards Champagne Brunch & Fox River Cruise Sunday June 17



# Quarterly ACBS meeting and tour of restoration facilities in Rhode Island

One of our stops Mystic Seaport, CT was The International Yacht Restoration School founded in Newport, Rhode Island, in 1993. Today, IYRS's 10,000 sq ft restoration facility is a busy working school on the Newport Waterfront. Originally, the facility was a power generation station plant when built in 1903. There wasn't a lot of student activity because it was spring break when we visited. Many first year students work on Beetle Cats. These boats provide a basic understanding of the restoration process.

We were taken to another building where we were awed at a massive hull. Built in 1885, the Coronet is the last of its kind, a 133ft Schooner in that no other large sailing yachts of her style and stature exist today. It is estimated that it will take two years and seven million dollars to restore her.

The May/June 2006 issue of WoodenBoat magazine has an excellent article about The International Yacht Restoration School.

#### Quarterly ACBS meeting and tour of restoration facilities in Rhode Island




There was a cocktail reception and private tour of The Herreshoff Marine Museum. Halsey Herreshoff, President of Museum talked about the goals of the museum. The collection has over 60 original Herreshoff boats, steam engines, artifacts, and brilliant photographs depcting America's greatest designeer and builder during "The Golden Age of Yachting".





Another stop was lunch at the Newport Clubhouse of the New York Yacht Club, overlooking Newport Harbor. Chris Smith did an impromptu stand up, giving some history about the New York Yacht Club. One of the symposium speakers, Chris Smith hardly needs an introduction. As grandson of the founder of Chris Craft (his grandfather and namesake, Christopher Columbus Smith), Chris' stories and anecdotes of "grandpa" have become both legendary and an invaluable historical perspective into our hobby. His involvement with Chris Craft began in the early 1950s, having served in key management positions and accumulating a wealth of first-hand knowledge about Chris Craft boats, management, design and production.




